### The Close of the Commandments

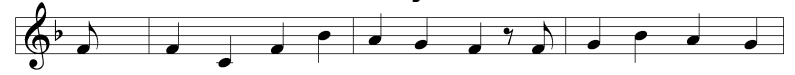
*What does God say about all these commandments?*

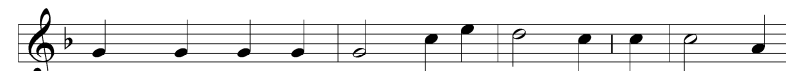
